3. T or F Physical abuse of a child is any injury that results in substantial physical harm to a child
4. T or F Persons are advised to first determine if there is a simple reason for marks on a child, before reporting suspicions of abuse.
5. T or F Teachers, employees, and adult volunteers should be prepared to interview children that disclose they are the victim of abuse.
6. T or F In the first scenario depicted in the video/DVD, the nurse makes a mistake by asking the parent instead of the child about the injury.
7. T or F Adults are encouraged to confront the suspected offender of abuse..
8. T or F In the third scenario depicted, the teacher responds correctly to the child's out cry by telling her she must go and get a counselor.
9. T or F Professionals (e.g. teachers, doctors, day care workers, etc.) have 1 week in which to report their suspicions of abuse.
10. T or F Persons reporting abuse should be prepared to provide as much information about the suspected abuse, including alleged victim's name, address, age, etc. and to give their own personal information too, because anonymous reports are not acceptable.
