The Saints will come marching in at area Catholic Schools Students to observe All Saints Day

At **2:00 p.m.** Kindergartners dressed as saints will parade through the halls of the school.

9:30 a.m. Parade of Saints following Mass with students dressed as their patron saints. The parade will be from the church through the school hallways.

St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic (Lower) School – 6255 E. Mockingbird Lane, Dallas 75214

9:30 a.m. Parade of Saints- Second graders will dress as their favorite saint and parade through the hallways of the lower school to the chapel where they will participate in a prayer service that will be live-streamed to the entire school.
