April 14 - Holy Thursday – 7:00 p.m.: (Bilingual Mass) During this Mass, Bishop Burns will wash the feet of parishioners just as Jesus washed the feet of the apostles before the Last Supper.

April 15 - Good Friday: 3:00 p.m.: Bishop Burns will preside at the **Good Friday** Passion of our Lord service. There will be no outdoor Stations of the Cross re-enactment at the cathedral this year.

Easter Vigil: 8:30 p.m. (English) Bishop Burns will celebrate the Easter Vigil Mass

Easter Sunday: 9:00 a.m. (Spanish) Fr. Delfin Corderi, **11:00 a.m.** (English) Bishop Burns

Other Parishes – Good Friday, April 15

The following churches are staging live reenactments of the Passion of the Cross. These feature parishioners in costume who will reenact the Stations of the Cross with one man portraying Jesus carrying a large cross and others portraying Roman centurions and others. This is very visual.

April 15 -8:30 a.m. (Bilingual) The Way of the Cross or the Via Dolorosa **will start from the Convent of the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth at 1814 Egyptian Way in Grand Prairie, 75050** and finish at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Grand Prairie. Up to 800 people are expected to attend.

April 15 – 4:30 p.m., (Bilingual) Live Stations of the Cross will start in the church parking lot behind the church. The pastor will lead the procession two blocks around the parish. As in pre-COVID years, more than 2,000 people are expected to participate in the procession.
